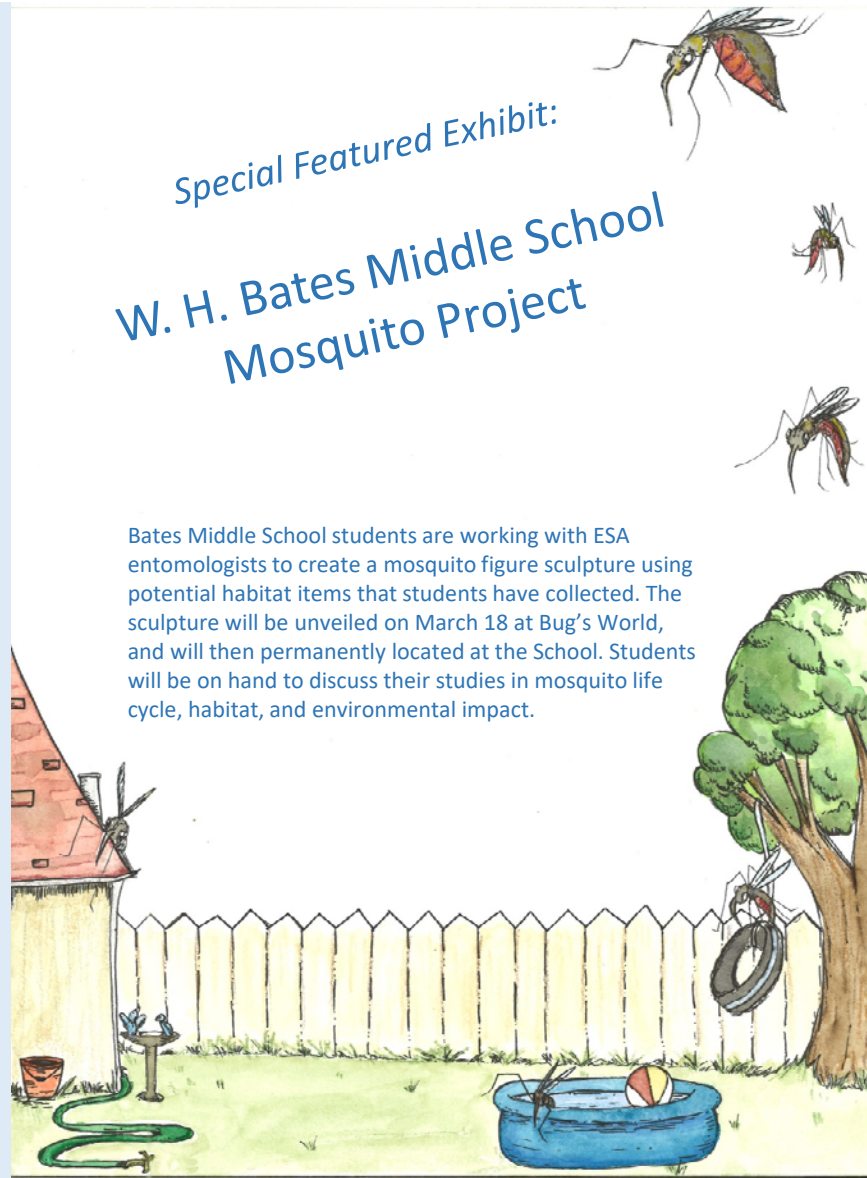
## It's a Bug's World
