# **Section Governing Council Capability Reporting**

The MUVE Section recruited Sydney Crawley as volunteer coordinator; Dini Miller and Jamie Blow as initiative leaders.

#### Wildly Important Goal #1: Medical Entomology Initiative

The MUVE Medical Entomology Citizen Science Outreach initiative conducted activities at Houston to educate citizens; presentation on the Invasive Mosquito Project to Nebraska science teachers about incorporating citizen science into their curriculum during the summer science workshop June 10<sup>th</sup>; continuing to build out the mosquito surveillance curriculum with new lessons, which are being tested in classrooms.

The STEM Bugs coordination group submitted a Workshop application for ESA 2019 and are expecting many participants.

### Wildly Important Goal #2: Urban Entomology Initiative

The Urban Entomology Group is working on a new initiative "IPM in low-income communities". Two conference calls including researchers, government officers were conducted. A symposium on "Improving Integrated Pest Management Strategies in Low-Income Housing Communities" will be held in May 2020 during the National Conference on Urban Entomology. The group will meet monthly to discuss policy, grant opportunities, collaborative activities.

# Wildly Important Goal #3: Veterinary Entomology Initiatives

The first initiative will identify existing training opportunities for veterinary entomologists and will determine gaps in training needs that will help facilitate development of new courses and also develop an online resource library of insect pictorial keys which can be useful across all MUVE membership. Online pictorial med/vet/forensic insect keys are being tested.

The goal of the second initiative is to generate a collection of library/research protocols that can be accessed online and referenced via DOI. A resource library for laboratory protocols has been created at protocols.io and is accepting member submissions

(https://www.protocols.io/groups/esa-muve/). A special collection of protocol and methods papers in Journal of Insect Science will be led by Erika Machtinger and will begin soliciting submissions this year.
